#### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Being an affiliated College, the curricula are designed and implemented by the University through the concerned Academic bodies including the Board of Studies. But 8 members of the Faculty either act as Chairpersons or members of the Board of Studies concerned

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Student centered Teaching Learning Process through ICT enabled mechanism, continuous Evaluation methods Tutorial system, assignments, seminars and internal assessments Teachers prepare Lesson and keep Diary along with the unitisation of Syllabi

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Timely evaluation of Unit Tests, seminars, assignments and holding of model examination along with the continuous evaluation of students. The internal Assessment of the students is published in time.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

Of the 7 teachers, who are about to complete research leading to Ph D through FIP scheme, Four Teachers had submitted their Ph.D theses and are awaiting Open Defence. Almost all members of the Faculty had already registered for research on part time basis and two teachers, Sri M. Kunheenkutty has been awarded Ph.D by the University of Calicut . Sri Jameel Ahamed is awaiting his Ph.D award.

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The Library is housed in the main buildings, and efforts are on for the realisation of separate Library Block, for which the Honourable M P and the Union Minister of State for Foreign Affairs, Sri E Ahamed has sanctioned Rs. 30,00,000/- (Rupees Thirty Lakh Only) for the construction under MPLAD Scheme. The work is to be started in the next year.

Smart Class rooms were set up for Entry into Service and Remedial Coaching

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Human Resource has been utilised for overall upliftment of backward sections of the society. The members of faculty contribute to the preparation of study materials of School of Distance education, University of Calicut, engage classes for those students, act as Resource persons for the Technical sessions of various competitative examinations, and support the activities of the local NGOs and organisations for their programmes of social importance.
