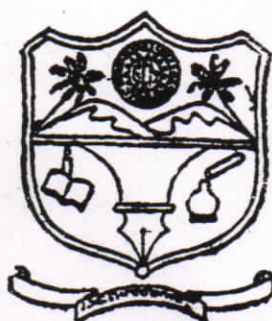

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

Year of Report: 2006-07

Part A

The plan of action chalked out by the **IQAC** at the beginning of the academic year 2006-07- towards quality enhancement and the outcome achieved at the end of the year.

Meeting of the **IQAC** held on 23.06.2006 discussed in detail the report and the findings of the Peer Team, that visited the College on the 22nd & 23rd March 2006 and resolved to overcome the hurdles already pointed out. In the light of the findings and recommendations, the meeting also resolved to initiate concrete and proper steps to implement the following in the college:

- 1)Reporting the vacant posts and creation of new posts in the Teaching and non-teaching)
- 2)Add on Courses.
- 3)Additional courses for the college. (PG and UG)
- 4)Setting up of Infflibnet Lab.
- 5)Starting Computerisation of College Library.
- 6)Inter-disciplinary programmes.
- 7)Development Programmes for Teaching and Non-teaching Staff
- 8)Marshalling internal resources.
- 9)Seminars and Workshops.
- 10) Office Modification

- 11) Maintenance of College buildings
- 12) Steps to arrest drop out ratio
- 13) Steps to make the student community computer literate
- 14) Outreach programme through N C C , N S S , Student's union etc.
- 15) Well equipping the Audio Visual Room
- 16) Celebrating the Golden Jubilee of the Formation of the State

Outcome Achieved:

1. The vacant posts in the teaching and non-teaching category in the college were reported in time and responded favourably by the Govt. All the vacant posts in the Department of Malayalam, English, Economics, Mathematics, Chemistry and Political Science were promptly filled up either through transfer or through fresh recruitment. Vacant posts in the office were also filled up. Commerce department were filled up.

2. An amount of Rs.7,00,000(Rupees Seven Lakh only) was sanctioned by UGC to the PG department of Economics to start Add on course in Computer Applications and Data Analysis.

3 It was proposed to start new courses in the college viz., MA (Arabic), BA (English) and B.Sc (Computer Science). The proposal to start new courses in the college (UG and PG) was discussed on the floor of the House (Legislative Assembly) and we expect favourable response from the Govt. The final approval about the same and also details regarding the courses sanctioned are awaited.

4. The INFLIBNET Lab started functioning from 17-12-2006 onwards with the whole hearted support and financial assistance from the Director, Collegiate Education Department, Govt. of Kerala, with 10 systems along with B S N L Broad Band connectivity. (Business 5000 plan). Dr.Sulaiman, Head of the department of Islamic History is in charge of the Lab

5. The computerization of the Library had begun from December onwards with Library automation software created by our own member of faculty, Sri PT.Unnikrishnan of the Physics Department.

6. A proposal for interdisciplinary programmes was mooted in the wake of various specialized careers that require such (interdisciplinary) an approach. The emphasis would be to provide exposure in such areas and equip the students with skills necessary for such studies. The different departments of the college –Economics and Commerce- have taken initiative in this regard. .

7. Our teachers attended various workshops and seminars as part of faculty development programme. The teachers of various departments also engaged in activities related to the design of various courses, the content and duration of such courses etc. The non-teaching staff of the college also attended various development programmes. Many of our teachers have registered for research in their areas of interests and specialization. The details of these programmes are mentioned in part B.

8. It was proposed to evolve a mechanism wherein the resourcefulness of the members of faculty of the college can be utilized to generate resources for the college.

9. An amount of Rs.40,000/-was approved and sanctioned by the Directorate of Collegiate Education, Govt. of Kerala to conduct seminars. In pursuance of the same, the Departments of Economics and Commerce jointly organized a two-day seminar. The details are mentioned in part B.

10. Steps have already been initiated for the modification of the office The college office has been provided with computers and staff were given training.

11. An amount of Rs.50000/- (Rupees Fifty Thousand only) has been received for minor works and maintenance of the college buildings. This amount has been utilized for repairing works and painting the walls of the Science. Block.

12. Concrete steps have already been undertaken to curtail the ratio of Drop outs in the College. The Women Cell and Students' Counselling Cell have started functioning with a view to motivate students, especially the girls for furthering education.

13. By using the facilities of the INFLIBNET Lab, Tutor of every class has materialized the dream of making every student computer literate. This has enabled the students to open their own E mail ID, which was pooled the main network

14. The major activities of the College have been made available to the public through National Service Scheme, National Cadet Corps and Students' Union. These include conducting of free medical camps, Awareness campaign Against Communicable diseases, importance of hygiene and cleanliness and rapport between the academic community and the public

15. By making use of the matching grant from the Govt to a tune of Rs.1,43,800 (Rupees One lakh forty thousand eight hundred only) the Audio Visual Room has been furnished with items of furniture, T V and Amplifier.

16 The golden Jubilee celebrations the formation of the state were held in high esteem and gaiety under the title DEEPTHA KERALAM. from November 1st to December 20th 2006. The formal inauguration the celebrations was held on 23rd November by Adv. M Ummer M L A. The activities got momentum with the presence of the one and only Sopanam Singer Sri Nharalath Hari Govindan, who presented a unique feat of 'Sopanasangeetam' with new notes without losing its traditional identity.

As part of the Deeptha Keralam, the Dept. of Economics organized a seminar on "How Kerala Lives and How Kerala Thinks" on 16th November 2006. Heated debates followed soon after the presentation the paper, which was the outcome of the comprehensive survey conducted by the Kerala Sasthra Sahitya Parishad, presented by Sri Sreedharan, District Secretary of the Organisation. A Health Seminar was held under the joint auspices of the three units of National Service Scheme and District Health Department on 27th November 2006. Dr. K N Dinesh District Medical Officer presented a paper on "Health Problems in Adolescence" and Dr. Sebastian Thomas spoke on "The Changing Life Style and Related Diseases"

Besides these, photo exhibition, Picture Exhibition, Exhibition on News Cuttings and Photos and Handicrafts Exhibition were held. A District-level competition in the recitation of folk song was held on 7th December 2006. It is noteworthy that our college stood first in this competition.

The valedictory function of the celebrations came to an end on 20th December 2006. It is to our pride that the Alumnae of the institution Sri.V.Sasikumar, the Hon. Member of Kerala Legislative Assembly, from Perinthalmanna constituency inaugurated the concluding session. He, spontaneously congratulated the staffers and students for making the celebrations a grand success.

Part B

Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution: -

The initiatives taken by the college to provide equity based quality education through its various courses, academic programmes, extra curricular activities, best practices and also the future proposals to the Govt. reflect the vision and mission of our Institution. Inter-disciplinary Programmes:-

i) The PG Departments of Commerce and Economics formally set an example in implementing inter-disciplinary programmes. These were manifested themselves in the celebration of PG Day, and in jointly hosting the National Seminar on "Emerging Trends in Business Environment and its Implications for Development". Moreover debates were held for the PG students channelising the mettle of the members of both the departments.

ii) In association with the Dept. of English, the Dept. of Arabic organized a workshop on the Technique of Translations from English to Arabic. Dr. MT. Abdussathar, Reader and HoD of Arabic, is the Chief Motivator of this programme.

The Dept. of History organized a seminar under the banner *Historia* on Tourism and Historical studies which was inaugurated by Sri.K.Dinesh, Secretary

District Tourism Promotion Council Malappuram. This was followed by the telecasting of documentaries, "Unknown Malappuram, Vydyaratnam P.S. Warriar and Poornaswaraj.

The Dept. of Economics conducted the activities of this academic year with a seminar on "Economics' Higher Education in Kerala, Problems and Prospects" on 1.2.2007 by Dr.EK Ummer, EMEA Kondotty which was followed by the screening of two documentaries, Snehayanam and Bahirakasa Jalakom".

The Dept. of Physics conducted the activities of this academic year with a seminar on "Application of Radiation in Medicine and Industry" on 10.1.2007 by Dr. Musthfa of the Department of Physics University Centre, University of Calicut.

The Dept. of Chemistry conducted the activities of this academic year with a seminar on "The Chemistry of Magic" on 1.12.2006 which was followed by a demonstration of folklore by Sri Manikandan Master.

Internal resources generated:-

The sources of funds are those which are sanctioned and allotted by the Govt. However, the expenses incurred for routine activities are met from the PTA(Parent –Teacher Association) Fund and CDC (College development council).We receive matching grant from the Govt. to the tune of amount collected by CDC .

The Govt. has allocated an amount of 4,50,000/-(Rupees Four Lakh Fifty thousand only) for the development of Lab and Library and the amount was utilized for the same. .

Community Services:-

i).The National Service Scheme Units of this College have involved themselves in the campaign against Chikun Gunea in the 5 wards of Malappuram Municipality. The volunteers also worked in tandem with the Municipal authorities to achieve the target of making Malappuram a "Green City.". The volunteers collected dresses from the students and the publis and handed over these to the inmates of the Mahila Mandir, "the Home for the Destitute Women" at Manjeri. .

Improvements in the library services:-

The computerization of Library has already begun.The library services are extended to 30 non-members who are our former students, former teachers and also local residents.

There have been 15008 issues (books issued) which is 700 more than last year. Further, it is very heartening to note that there have been 22005 visits to the library by readers this year, which is 400 more than last year.

New books/journals subscribed and their cost:-

1033 new books have been added to the library this year. Also the periodicals and weekly amounts to **Rs.20342/-**

Courses in which student assessment of teachers is introduced and the action taken on student feedback:-

All the members of the faculty of the college took students' feedback and remedial steps have been taken to address the problems and anxieties

of the students.

Computerization of administration and the process of admissions and examination results, issue of certificates:-

The softwares developed by Sri unnikrishnan, of Physics department pertaining to computerized admission, to our courses (UG & PG) were used. The final examinations are conducted by the University and consequently, the results are declared by the University.

Increase in Infrastructural facilities:-

An amount of Rs.4 50,000/ is sanctioned for purchase of books and equipments for Laboratory and the amount has been utilized for the same.

The Audio Visual Room has been furnished with furniture, sound system, L C D with screen and made it modern.

Technology Upgradation:-

As mentioned earlier, it is our objective to computerize the Library and in the next year onwards we plan switch over to open source software. As already mentioned Infilbnet Lab started functioning .

Computer and internet access and training to teachers and students:-

Internet access is available to all teachers and students during college working hours. The Career Guidance and Placement Cell has been making sincere attempts to the College community computer literate.

Financial aid to students:-

Govt fee concessions are available for SC/ST and other economically backward communities.

Support from the Alumni Association and its activities:-

The Alumni association has been working in tandem with the College Council to make the institution the hub of higher education providing quality education to all the stake holders. For this the association has already made plan of action highlighting the academic improvement of the college.

Support from the Parent –Teacher Association and its activities:-

The source of funds are those which are sanctioned and allotted by the Govt. However, the expenses incurred for routine activities are met from the PTA (Parent –Teacher Association) Fund.

2 . A seminar on 'the changing scenario of Higher Education'


We have already applied the Director of Collegiate Education for a seminar on 'The changing scenario of Higher Education', which has been the focal point of attention among academics and even public.
