The Parent Teacher Association involves itself in the maintenance, routine repair of all the electrical, electronic and other tools and gadgets. It also assists and motivates the stakeholders in keeping the discipline of the campus intact and strives to improve the academic ambience of the institution.

6.13 Development programmes for support staff

Separate and specific space has been allotted for the staff for the leisure and off hours. They were also asked to go for training programmes conducted not only by Govt. agencies, but by other agencies as well.

6.14 Initiatives taken by the institution to make the campus eco-friendly

Concerted efforts were on to make the Campus eco friendly, including Plastic Free. An herbal garden has been set up to inculcate the significance of Trees and herbal saplings in the day to - day life of the people. Classes by experts on ecology were also held during the period.
